Swimming pool fences must comply with swimming pool regulations and will be inspected and approved by an authorised person prior to filling the pool with water. Contact Council to arrange an inspection.

Although building surveyors do not supervise construction work, inspections may be carried out from time to time. Council should be notified of the completion of construction work.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Who is eligible to vote?

Residents enrolled as electors for State and Federal elections are eligible to vote and will be automatically included on the Council electoral roll.

If they wish to vote locally, owners and occupiers who are not on the electoral roll need to apply to go on the roll before the next local government election.

Ordinary elections are held every two years, with half the membership of the Council up for election each time. The next local government elections are scheduled to be held in October 2011. Candidates standing for election are required to submit a personal profile which is intended to assist electors in casting their vote.

The Town of Kwinana uses the postal voting method, which means ballot packs are posted to all electors on the roll. Votes are posted back by the elector which means that electors do not have to attend a polling booth on the election day.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

Kwinana Town Council actively encourage community participation in its decision making process. Council meets twice a month (except January and December) on the second and fourth Wednesdays, at 7pm. Meetings are open to the whole community and are held at the Council Chambers, Town of Kwinana Administrative Centre, Sulphur Road, Kwinana. Members of the public may ask questions at the two Question Time sections of the meeting or provide a community submission on any matter on the agenda for that meeting.

If you wish to address Council on an agenda item, this can be done through Community Submissions. To do this, you must give written notice to Kwinana's Chief Executive Officer by 12 noon on the day of the meeting.

Agendas for Council meetings are available one week prior to each meeting on the Town's website (www.kwinana.wa.gov.au), at the Administration Centre office, Library, and Citizen's Advice Bureau at the Hub Shopping Centre. Minutes detailing the decisions that occur at all Council meetings are made available within five working days following each meeting and are also widely available.

In addition, all Council's committees which have delegated authority to make decisions are also open to the public. The public has similar rights at these meetings, where there is also provision for public question time.

Kwinana advertises the dates of all of its meetings, and as far as is practicable, also advertises any special meetings to be held.

Council also offers opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in public consultation and decision making processes by making minutes and agendas available on request in alternative formats. RANGER & EMERGENCY SERVICES

This department is responsible for community safety by responding to incidents and enforcing laws. Among the areas covered are:

Parking

Rangers enforce parking restrictions, particularly in disabled bays, around schools and parking over footpaths.

Dog Control

Each year dogs are involved in attacks and cause traffic accidents by wandering on roads. All dogs over the age of three months are required to be registered and kept on a lead when in a public place, unless in an approved dog exercise area.

Off Road Vehicles/Trail bikes

The Medina Off-Road Vehicle Area is a small dedicated area located in the northern portion of a relatively large area of bushland bounded by Thomas Road and Rockingham Road. Those who do not ride within this area and do not have their off-road vehicle registered risk being issued heavy fines and having their vehicle impounded for up to 12 months.

Fire and Emergency Laws

For environmental reasons, burning is prohibited in the town site and only permitted in the rural area under strict guidelines during certain times of the year. Before 1st December of each year all property owners are required to prepare their property for the coming fire season. Failure to do so could result in legal action, and even worse, could endanger our community.

There are also extensive powers given to Officers under the Emergency Management Act 2005. For your safety, please follow instructions of Officers during emergencies.

Emergency Services

Council is committed to prevent disasters and assist the community when an emergency occurs. It works closely with Police, FESA, Department of Child Protection and other agencies. The following are Local Emergency agencies:

Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC)

LEMC consists of members of Emergency Services and the community. Their job is to develop and test arrangements (plans) for likely emergencies. This includes response of Council resources; setting up Evacuation

Centres and helping the community recover from a major incident.

Fire Services

Kwinana has two Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades; Mandogalup and Kwinana South who are responsible for fires east of the freeway. There is also a Volunteer Fire and Rescue Brigade. The brigades work closely with other Council Brigades and FESA.

State Emergency Services (SES)

There is a joint Rockingham/Kwinana Volunteer SES Unit which operates from Rockingham.

Cadets

There is a joint Rockingham/Kwinana Emergency Services Cadet Unit for High School students. It operates from Rockingham High School. For more information contact Phil Brown on 9419 1164.

Emergency Training

A short training session is run for Council staff each year outlining Emergency Services and how they can assist if the need arises. Rangers are trained to assist in emergencies. Some are Volunteer Fire Brigade Officers. Rangers have an Animal Welfare Plan for emergencies. The Depot staff is regularly called in to manage traffic and clear the roads following fires and storms. Other officers such as Engineers, Health, Environment, Building officers etc can also be called in to provide their special skills if the need arises.

Community Emergency Services Coordinator (CESC)

Please be aware the only emergencies rangers are authorised to respond to are: wandering livestock, and other major road hazards; dogs which are attacking people or other animals; major vandalism to Council property.

RATES

If you have recently changed your address please advise the rates team in writing. Rates are due within 35 days of the date of issue unless arrangements have been made to pay by instalment or direct debit. Beyond this date, rates are in arrears and are recoverable by legal action. Council offers a number of rates payment options as detailed on your rates notice. You can pay at BPoint, BPay, Australia Post, at the Council Administration office, by two or four instalments, direct debit or Pay in Advance.

Pensioners/Seniors

Eligible pensioner/seniors are entitled to a rebate (maximum of 50 percent on their rates and ESL). Service charges, i.e., rubbish and swimming pool inspection fees are not subject to a concession and must be paid in full by the due date unless paying by instalments.

Bulk Waste Collections

Council will provide bulk verge waste collection services during 2010/2011 consisting of 4 Green Waste Collections and 1 Junk/White Goods verge collection.

Brochures are delivered to all houses in June/July each year. It is required that the conditions outlined by Council are met by householders; otherwise the contractor will not remove your rubbish.

Resource Recovery Services Brochure

This brochure, which provides the requirements for all Waste and Resource Recovery Services including the service frequency, maps, times, contact details and what, where and how to dispose of unwanted materials. The brochure indicates the correct collection week for each area and fortnightly resource recycling is collected the same day as the rubbish bin service.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Paints, household pesticides, poisons, solvents, thinners, degreasers and similar chemicals can be disposed of at the Regional HHW Collection facility at the Millar Road Landfill site. For further information phone the City of Rockingham landfill on 9524 2053.

Removal of Disused material, Rubbish and Overgrown Vegetation

Requests to improve the tidiness of Kwinana may be lodged. Property inspections are done to ensure properties with overgrown grass, rubbish, car bodies and disused material is removed. Formal notices may be issued under the Local Government Act, if residents or owners fail to comp. It may result in fees per inspection until the notices are met. Council may carry out the work and recover all costs including legal fees.

Towards a Litter-Free Kwinana

The Litter Act provides an on-the-spot penalty of \$200 for littering and \$75 for cigarette butts includes penalties for illegal dumping and failing to respond to the direction of an authorised officer. Kwinana has a clean environment and citizens can do their part by reporting illegal dumping and littering on 9439 0231 or 9439 0275.
